How to get the most from Your Identity Discovery Deck

If you have already been through the Identity Discovery Deck, here are some ways to extend the impact and value of your experience.

Build on your special strengths



The top 5-10 1s you pick are important strengths in their own right. Look upon them as your “identity muscles” to be exercised in a variety of situations that call for you to bring the best of you to the task, or challenge at hand – for example, challenges at work, or in connection with a family matter, or community project.

Dig into your discards



You can learn a lot about yourself by taking a close look at your 3s – those cards you discarded, which represent activities that “just don’t do it for you.” Are these activities ones you just don’t like, or are there other reasons you shied away from them? Take another look. See what emerges.

Turn your Deck into a success tool



Sharpen how you communicate what you’re really good at and how you can make a difference. Use the insights from the Deck to improve your Summary or Goal paragraph on your resume, or conduct a more memorable job interview. You can even apply your Deck results to how you describe yourself on your website and in social media – for instance, on LinkedIn – in ways that deepen your perceived credibility and set you apart from others.

Create an identity support community



Connect with others who have also experienced the Identity Discovery Deck and who can speak the *language of identity* with you. Put together a few such people and you now have an informal community of like-minded individuals who can understand and support one another.

Make the decks a family affair
